In partnership with Vibrant Futures, any Early Learning Corps (ELC) Interventionist who serves the duration of the school year may opt to complete the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential.



DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP

Davenport University has been leveraging the benefits of the MEC experience and the College of Urban Education for the past two years. Interventionists who want to become educators are encouraged to consider Davenport's Certificate in Urban Education alternative route to teacher certification post-baccalaureate program. MEC service time can help with tuition reduction for this program through a combination of the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award and Davenport partnership tuition grants.
